PROV 701: PREPARING FOR CAREER IN THE ACADEMY

This seminar will be devoted to helping upper-level doctoral and MFA students strengthen their instructional effectiveness and to exploring and preparing for future academic careers. Specifically, the seminar will address student engagement strategies for promoting learning, teaching for critical thinking, and classroom management. Participants will learn how to construct a meaningful statement of teaching philosophy and to plan for a course through syllabus design.

Through investigating academic career paths, the seminar will provide a clearer understanding of the roles and responsibilities of being a faculty member. We will spend a significant amount of time exploring the details and the vagaries of the academic job market, with an eye toward preparing a job application portfolio. In addition to a teaching philosophy and syllabus, then, participants will create a cover letter, a research statement, and a CV appropriate for an academic job application.

CTCH 601: THE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

This hybrid course provides an overview of how various types of community colleges have evolved and how they function. Themes running through the course address policies, trends, issues and innovations influencing the evolution of community colleges throughout their over 100 year history. Beginning with a brief history of community colleges in the U.S., the course offers content dealing with variety, foundations, governance and administration, curriculum, faculty, and students and student outcomes. The course also offers a critical examination of community colleges, considering their strengths and weaknesses within the broader context of higher education and will be integrated with a variety of theories and philosophical perspectives that guide the operations and assumptions in higher education.

HONORS 110: RESEARCH METHODS

The introductory course for Honors College students with the goal of developing skills in academic writing, understanding argumentation from multiple perspectives, and applying different humanities based research methods. Students engage in a semester long research project of their interest.

CTCH 792: CURRENT TRENDS IN HIGHER EDUCATION

Doctoral and master's level course with a focus on the current issues and trends impacting higher education. Organized around three major theoretical frameworks – higher education as a public good, human capital theory, and democratic education – the topics range from faculty governance to the rise of contingent faculty to financial aid.

CTCH 792: RESEARCH WRITING

Graduate writing course to encourage and assist students in learn how to write academically and in making substantive progress toward the identification and development of a research topic.

CTCH 622: ORGANIZATIONAL ADMINISTRATION IN HIGHER EDUCATION

Doctoral and master's level course with a focus on organizational theories applied to higher education to provide opportunities to explore and generate greater understanding of the culture of organization and administration in higher education. Focused on leadership, change, and governance as key aspects of administration using a case-study approach.

CTCH 792: Advanced Organization Theory and Behavior in Higher Education

This doctoral seminar is designed as an advanced organizational studies course to provide opportunities to deeply engage in the empirical and theoretical debates in organizational studies over the last few decades. To engage organizational theory in doctoral level work (i.e., a dissertation), a through understanding of the theoretical traditions, debates, and assumptions is a prerequisite for work that contributes to the literature. This class will focus on deep readings of texts, constructive critique, and presentation in a collegial and reciprocal learning environment. Students will be expected to attend class, be current with the issues facing higher education, and actively engage in course discussions.

CTCH 792: LEADERSHIP IN HIGHER EDUCATION

This course focuses on the leadership of higher education and the role of leaders in institutional transformation. The major focus is the complex social and political environments and the current and future trends of higher education with a foundational grounding in the study of leadership theory and research.

CTCH 792: ORGANIZATIONAL CULTURE IN HIGHER EDUCATION

The purpose of this course is to examine organizational culture in higher education with attention to the symbols, myths, sagas, rituals, and social norms prevalent across colleges and universities. Organizational culture can be understood as the sum total of the assumptions, beliefs, and values that its members' share. We will focus on current events and trends to deconstruct campus sub-cultures, relationships across constituent groups, trust, values, resistance, and institutional transformation, among other topics.

NCLC 375: EDUCATION AND SOCIETY

Introductory undergraduate course designed to provide opportunities to explore and generate greater understanding of the role of educational institutions within society. Topics examine include: the functions of education in society; the role of education in promoting economic development; the development and application of social and cultural capital; the effects of racial segregation; and resource inequality.
